## Html free templates for online shopping

This law protects account holders by limiting their fraud liability to \$50. Payments for unauthorized charges on a credit card can also be put on hold and examined [source: FTC]. Even better, most credit card companies offer more protection, sometimes limiting consumer liability for fraud to zero. Using a debit card also provides you with federal protection. If you notify your bank of a fraudulent debit card purchase within two days, your liability is limited to \$50; after that, it increases to \$500 [source: Bankrate]. Many online retailers offer free shipping on purchases over a certain dollar amount, and online coupon sites often offer free shipping coupon codes. If you can't catch a break on shipping, ordering early enough will allow you to opt for standard shipping. It's almost always the slowest, but if you order early, you have time on your side. Give yourself a little more time if you order from a third-party seller through a large online retailer. The retail website's shipping date is an estimate, one that the seller doesn't always meet.
